⇒Math:

Students continued reviewing strategies to solve addition problems this week. Next week we will review all of our strategies and evaluate the benefits of each.

Literacy:

We continued our work with the Overcoming Learning Challenges near and far module by reading Rain School and Nasreen's Secret School. The students are learning to read for gist (the main idea) and then close read to find specific details that support the lesson, message or moral of the text. Ask your child to tell you about Thomas and/or Nasreen from this week's stories.

⇒Social Studies:
