⇒Math:

Students are continuing to practice modeling their understanding of addition and subtraction using various strategies. Next week, students will apply their understanding of numbers by rounding to the nearest ten and hundred.

Literacy :

Students completed the Beginning of Grade Test (BOG) this week.

We continued our work with the Overcoming Learning Challenges near and far module by revisiting <u>Nasreen's Secret School</u>. The students are learning to read for gist (the main idea) and then close reading to find specific details within the text that support the lesson, message or moral of the text.

\Rightarrow Social Studies:

Students are describing how people adapt to their environment. We are examining how second graders adapt to third grade, and applying this understanding to how characters in the stories we have read have adapted to or changed their environment. Ask your child to use the world map in their homework agenda to show you the relative location of these countries to the United States.

⇒Science:

This week we continued our unit on Force and Motion by examining gravity as a special kind of pull. All forces are either pushes or pulls. Next week we will infer how objects will change direction or speed based on the effect of different forces.
